Run a google search for number of U.S gun deaths in 2013 and your search will return startling numbers like these: Killed 11,419. Years stolen 502,025. Percent men and boys 84. Percent 30 and under 48. These numbers reveal nothing of the merely wounded or disabled --or of families shattered.

It is numbers like these that led places of worship across the nation to join the Washington National Cathedral and Faiths United to Prevent Gun Violence, a coalition of 50 national denominations and faith-based organizations, to remember lives lost to

gunfire, to pray for those whose lives have been forever changed because of the loss of a loved one, and to continue the discussion on how communities of faith can work together to help reduce gun violence. The March 13-16 National Gun Violence Prevention Sabbath Weekend was kicked off at special ceremonies held at the National Cathedral the evening of Thursday, March 13. 

Beware "The Grandparent's Scam"

Elmo Webb picked up the ringing phone and heard a young voice ask Hello, Grandpa?" to which he answered "Matt, is that you?" "Yes, Grandpa." said the young man. "I'm in trouble and need your help. I'm stranded in Toronto. I came up with some friends to attend a concert and after it was over we rented a car to come

home. I was sleeping in the back seat when we were stopped for speeding. When the police saw a car full of boys, they decided to search the car and they found drugs hidden under the back seat. The police arrested us and when they took us in, they tested us for drugs. I was clean but they said they need \$3,000 for my bail. I was allowed one call so I called you. You won't tell anyone about this will you, Grandpa? They told me that two days after I leave Toronto, they will return the money. You will help me, won't you, Grandpa? You do believe it is me, don't you?" Although many would have fallen for this without a second thought, Elmo's background held him in good stead. You see, Elmo is a retired D.C. Policeman. He remembered that Matt's iden-



tity was stolen just a month before this call so he asked the caller, "Tell me, when were you born?" All of a sudden the line went dead. A phone call to Matt was all that was needed to show this for the scam it was.

Another person I spoke with had this tale to tell. As she was coming into the house, her phone was ringing. She hurried to answer it before it went to the answer service. "Hello" she said. "Grandma, is that you?" asked the young lady. "Yes," she said. "I didn't expect to hear from you so soon," "Grandma, I need your help" she said. "What's the matter, hon?" the grandmother asked. "Grandma, I came down to Cozumel with two of my friends and we have been robbed. We went swimming and when we got back to our room, we had been robbed. They took our

passports, our return tickets and all our money. We are stranded here. I don't want Mom or Dad to know about this because they did not really want me to go with my friends in the first place. You will help me, won't you? All I need is enough to pay our hotel bill and buy new plane tickets. About \$2,500 should be enough. I'll get it back to you just

as soon as I get back home." When the grandmother told the caller she would have to get the money from the caller's dad because she did not have it, the connection was abruptly broken. She then called her granddaughter, who was home in Philadelphia, and alerted her of what was happening.

These are 2 of the many examples of the type of phone scams to be aware of. There are many kinds of e-mail scams as well. We are all recipients of them. Just stop and think before becoming a victim. Be sure there is an emergency before reacting like a very concerned parent or grandparent. To be fore-warned is to be fore-armed. several congregations to share in this witness on behalf of everyone in our diocese. The total number of deaths by gunfire in 2013 in the District and the state of Maryland are appalling. As a Christian congregation deeply committed to the common good for all people, we felt the need to call this terrible death toll to the attention of our entire community. As we set up the crosses on the church lawn, with the names of victims from our and several nearby counties, we were staggered by the number, and the relative youth of many who had died.

These crosses signify not only the loss of their lives, but also the tragedy taking place daily across our nation as the plague of death by gunfire continues to spread. As we began to erect the display, we stopped and prayed for all the dead and tried to imagine the many gifts and dreams lost to their families and to the communities in which they lived. We prayed for these girls and boys, men and women and now call upon our whole community to stand up to this carnage and to work together for reasonable regulations and laws concerning the buying and selling of guns.

The National Cathedral in Washington, D.C., has long been a "house of prayer for all people," and voice from our moral center on the issues of social and economic justice, reconciliation on local and international levels, and the pursuit of peace throughout the world that is inclusive and just, as well as on the spiritual vocation Christians have to honor and respect people of all faiths.

As a citizen of Prince George's County, I [Rev. Clark] am particularly concerned about gun


Boy Scouts Learn About Microscopic Science

In February, the Boy Scout Troop visited the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Electron and Confocal Microscopy Unit (ECMU) at the Beltsville Agricultural Research Center. This visit is part of the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) program with the Boy Scouts of America. The purpose of the program is to encourage the natural curiosity of boys and instill in them a sense of wonder and awe of the world around us. Dr. Gary Bauchan, Director of the ECMU, gave a tour of the facility.

The scouts were shown one of the boys own hair at 1000 times magnification using a table top scanning electron microscope (SEM); movies of creepy crawly microscopic insects in 3D; fluorescent plant leaves with glowing bacteria on them using a confocal laser scanning microscope; plant viruses magnified 100,000 their actual size in a transmission electron microscope; and highly magnified SEM images of snowflakes, fungi, worms, interior cells of a plant, and lots of insects.

Following their tour the scouts met with Dr. Ronald Ochoa, a scientist in the Entomology Laboratory. He gave the scouts a colorful and animated presentation about microscopic mites (small bugs closely related to spiders) which the scouts discovered can be found everywhere. The scouts were amazed that dust mites can be found in their sleeping bags and home carpets; spider mites on the plants in their home; brightly colored mites can be found in soil and the trees in their yard and on the oranges and apples that they eat; insect mites can be found living on bees and mosquitoes; and mites can be even found at the base of your eye lashes on your face. A real itchy thought! The scouts left with a better appreciation of how science, engineering, math and computer technology can be used to design powerful microscopes which allow scientists to study

the microscopic world which we live in and help solve agricultural problems using microscopy.





their problem solving ability as well as computational fluency. The programs are designed so that students not only know if they are correct but often receive clues that will help them answer problems if they make an error on their first attempt. This program was approved and purchased by the Mathematics Department for all 3rd, 4th and 5th graders in Prince George's County.

Calverton has 347 playing in the First In Math county, state, and national competition. We also have our second graders playing non-competitively as well as some first graders added to the second grade teams.

Currently Calverton is ranked 1st in Prince George's County, 4th in Maryland and 58th in the United States. Mrs. McClain's 3rd grade Unison Team is ranked 1st at Calverton as well as 1st among all the third grade teams playing in Maryland. Nationally the Unison Team is ranked 32nd in the United States compared with other third grade teams competing.

Our goal is to have all players reach at least 3,000 stickers by the end of the competition on April 30. Currently we have 79 students who have met that challenge and we hope to add a lot more.

We have 4 students who are ranked in the Top 100 Players in Maryland. Congratulations to Chibuikem Oguayo, Rashard Miller, Araba Haque Rohan, and Aldrine Rozario. To get on that exclusive list players needed at least 12,085 stickers on March 14. To stay on the list they will need more since the number increases based on the competition.


