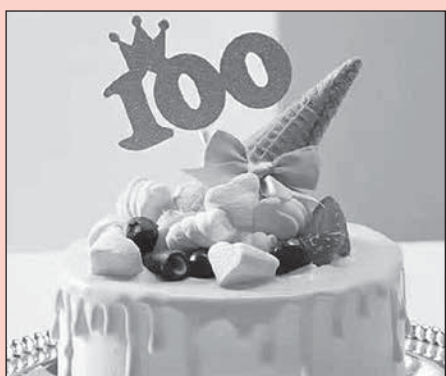

North County Advisory Neighborhood Community (ANC) Update

The Advisory Neighborhood Community (ANC) Initiative is an exciting new, countywide community engagement and volunteer service initiative of my county council at-large office designed to empower communities with information about their local government and encourage them to be advocates for their communities.

The ANC Initiative is open to the public and is organized in 2019 to meet in regional cluster meetings in April, June, September, and November with a countywide ANC meeting in December.

Each ANC regional cluster will have a policy committee and a special projects committee. Residents can sign up for one or both committees.

The ANC policy committees will focus on policy priorities for specific ANCs in areas such as

education, transportation, public safety and human services, economic development and zoning, and the environment.

The ANC special projects committees will focus on establishing and/or supporting community service, pride-building projects, community-school partnerships, and other community improvement projects needed for specific ANCs.

The ANC policy and special projects committees will meet in the interim between regional cluster meetings and report back ideas and initiatives for discussion and action. Papa Was a Rollin' Stone

I guess some men seeing the title of this 1972 hit by the Temptations are crying FOUL! They may be asking why I picked this over other songs. The song was popular and held some truths, but I picked it because of its potential. Confused? Let me explain. My first Father's Day message was titled, "Papa Was a Rollin' Stone. Why?" My answer was because he was allowed to be. The instrumental is fantastic! The line about him being a storefront preacher got my attention. But it's the chorus that stands out for me, "Papa was a Rollin' Stone. Wherever he laid his hat was his home. And when he died, all he left us was alone." When I read the lyrics, one of the male teens spoke out and said, "Dag, that's messed up!" Yes, it is.

In my faith tradition, the Bible has numerous stories about women coming together to meet the needs of the family and community. Those situations presented opportunities for support, sharing resources, and accountability. Men were engaged in activities that took them away from the family.

I was blessed to have my father at home to help lay the foundation of how people viewed the Chase Family. Both of my parents grew up without their parents who died when my parents were young. They knew the importance of a consistent, positive, male presence. Our home was "the" gathering place. The men in their circle of friends were expected to live up to the standard that my parents set. My father was a construction

foreman. I was surprised by the report of my middle brother who worked with my father one summer. Apparently, the men cursed and told dirty jokes on the construction site! No! Not my daddy! My memory is of him asking a male friend to leave our home for refusing to stop cursing around his wife and daughters. He set the boundaries for how the women and children should be treated in our extended family, and it included our friends. When he died, the village he created showed up and grieved with us.

I'm biased, but I feel if men followed my father's example and considered coming together to fill fatherless voids, we would have fewer "Rollin' Stones." 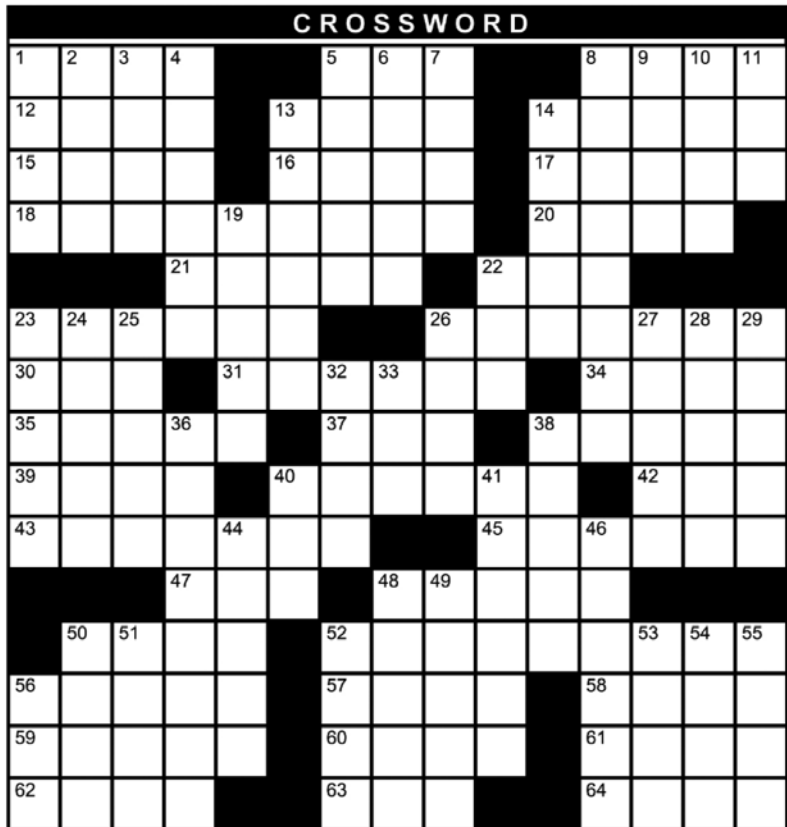

Federal Real ID requirements—NOW is the time to ACT

If you haven't visited the Maryland Department of Transportation Motor Vehicle Administration (MDOT MVA) recently, you may be required to bring additional documentation on your next visit. The federal Real ID Act, legislation created post 9/11,

now requires customers to provide proof of identity, Social Security, and Maryland residency documents when completing a transaction if you do not already have those documents on file with MDOT MVA. Starting October 1, 2020, a Real ID will be necessary to board commercial airplanes and enter federal facilities.

If you're unsure if your license is Real ID compliant, visit the MDOT MVA's REAL ID Lookup Tool at www.mva.maryland.gov/realidlookup. The Lookup Tool will ask for a driver's license number and advise if you need to bring in the required REAL ID documents. If you are required to bring in documents, the MDOT MVA REAL ID Online Document Guide, www.mva.maryland.gov/odg, walks you through the required documentation needed including one proof of age and identity, one proof of social security, and two proofs of Maryland residential address. To expedite your visit, the Online Document Guide gives you an option to make an appointment with a guarantee to be seen within 15 minutes of check-in. Learn more about Real ID at www.maryland.gov/realid.

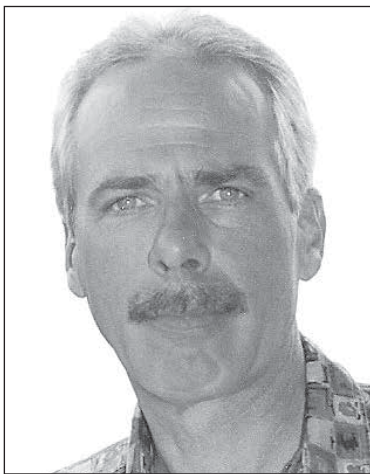

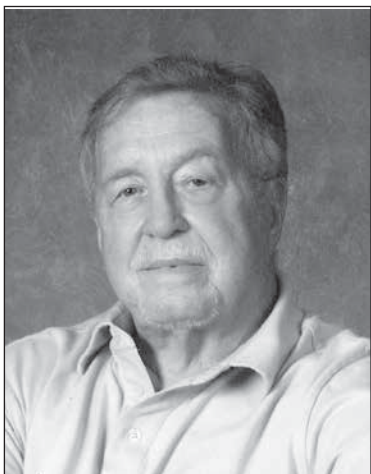

Laptop Computers: What You Should Know

May and June are popular months for graduations, and laptop computers make a popular gift for the graduating student. This month we will take a short look at laptop computers and what you should know before you purchase one. We will look at the operating system software first and then explore the hardware components.



Occasionally seen is the hybrid drive that offers a small SSD combined with a large hard drive. The SSD stores the data that is accessed most frequently, giving much of the performance of the SSD with the larger size the hard drive.

Networking

A modern laptop should have Wi-Fi, Ethernet, and Bluetooth networking capability. Wi-Fi is the wireless technology that allows the computer to connect to the Internet. A new computer should support at least the 802.11ac wireless standards. Some laptops today do not include the traditional wired Ethernet jack. This can be a problem when trying to fix networking issues or when traveling to locations that still don't have Wi-Fi.

Bluetooth is a short range networking capability that can be used for connecting mice, headsets, speakers, phones, and other accessories to the computer. Most computers today offer Bluetooth versions 4 or 5.

Battery

If you travel, battery life can be important. I always look for at least 4-5 hours of battery. Many new laptops come with batteries that are not replaceable. I try to avoid these if I can so I can purchase a spare and swap batteries if needed.

is between Intel Core i3, Core i5, and Core i7 or the AMD Ryzen 5 or Ryzen 7 series. The Ryzen 5 and 7 are comparable to the Intel i5 and i7 in performance and are less costly but are also currently less common in laptops. Of these CPU series, look for the most cores and threads you can afford.

GPU

While the CPU is the primary calculating engine, the graphics processing unit is the part that sends information to the screen. Performance here is very important for high-end gaming, and movie and photo editing. The GPU is also used to accelerate certain other computation tasks that it can do faster than the CPU. There are three choices here: NVIDIA, AMD, and Intel. Most people consider the current line of NVIDIA GeForce GTX series to be the best for laptop, but the AMD RX series is generally competitive. The Intel HD series is typically used for computers with lighter graphics needs intended for office work.

Screen

Unlike desktop computers, the screen is built into the laptop. There are two measures that are important: the size in inches and in pixels. Laptop screens typically fall within the range of 13 to 17 inches with 15.6 inches being the most popular. The three most common laptop screen resolutions are 1366 by 768 pixels, 1920 by 1080 pixels, and 4K or 3840 by 2160 pixels. Windows 10 seems to work best with the 1920 by 1080 resolution.

Memory, RAM and Storage

Random Access Memory, or RAM, is used when processing information. The more RAM the better. Four gigabytes would be the minimum most users would need, but eight is better. If you are lucky, you may find a laptop with 16 gigabytes of RAM.

Storage is what we used to call the hard drive. Today there is a choice of hard drive or solid state drive (SSD). SSD is much faster than a hard drive but is more expensive and typically stores less information. Usually, an SSD may hold 256 to 512 gigabytes of data compared to one or two terabytes of data stored on a hard drive.

Operating Systems

For most practical purposes, there are four operating systems to consider: Windows 10, Chrome OS, Linux, and macOS. The choice of operating system will impact your choice of computer. The macOS operating system is typically limited to Apple computers, and the choice would drive you to purchasing an Apple. In a similar fashion a choice of Chrome OS is going to drive you to a computer that runs that operating system natively. Chrome OS is designed for running applications from the web. Chromebooks are computers built to run Chrome OS. Chromebooks tend to have limited power when compared to other computers and are typically less expensive. They may be a good choice for those people that only need to run applications on the web and check their email.

The Linux operating system will run on most computers, including the Apples, and some Chromebooks. Only a handful of computers are available with Linux pre-installed. Most people that want to run Linux install it to run on a Windows machine.

Windows 10 is currently the most popular operating system for laptop computers. Prices for Windows laptops can range from as low as \$200 to more than \$2,000. The two most common versions of Windows 10 are Home and Pro. Pro is designed to connect to domain-based networks that are typically in companies while Home is targeted for the typical home user.

Hardware

Hardware is the collection of components used to build the laptop. The hardware impacts the performance and other capabilities of the computer.

CPU

The CPU is the central processing unit, the primary calculating engine for the computer. We could go into a lot of details about CPU performance, like cores, threads, cache size, and clock speeds, but most people do not need that much information. Instead, there are three major brands of CPU manufacturers, Intel, AMD, and ARM. Only a few laptops run on an ARM CPU, and these are mostly lower powered Chromebooks. So, for the typical buyer, the choice

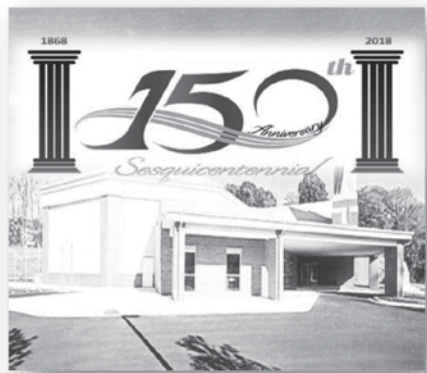
Remember our big bingo every Tuesday and Wednesday at noon, our Friday night dinner and danc-

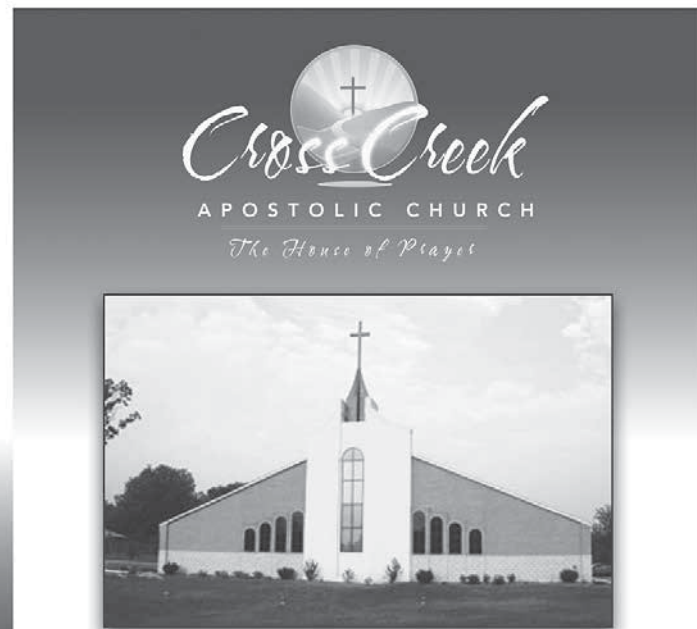
