Prince George's County Schools Announces Its Fall Reopening Plan

On Wednesday, July 15, Prince George's County Schools CEO Monica Goldson announced that schools in the county will do full-time distance learning for the entire first semester of the 2020–2021 school year. This seems to line up with our polling at *The Beltsville News* where 77% of respondents to a poll about school opening options wanted to remain in distance learning.

The CEO explained in her letter to the community that, "When I was chosen to lead Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS), I committed to putting our children first. Now, especially during these times, my focus on these core values remains the same." She goes on to state that the decision was made in consultation with a number of stakeholders such as parents, teachers, administrators, and the PGCPS Reopening Task Force as well as community surveys.

She promises that as they "work to enhance our distance learning model, we will provide more live instruction in addition to pre-recorded lessons. All students will be equipped with their own digital device to support our district-wide goal. We are also improving instructional supports for students, both individually and in small groups, in core subject areas and increasing access to social and emotional learning opportunities."





BCC Is "Purr"oud of Our Accomplishments

Beltsville Community Cats (BCC) is excited to share our key accomplishments since being established in March 2019 as a program of Laurel Cats. BCC's mission is to sterilize free-roaming cats throughout Beltsville. Between March and December 2019, BCC spay/neutered 111 cats and placed 44 kittens in foster and/or adoptive homes.

Even with COVID-19 and the recent 2-month ban on spay/neuter surgeries in Maryland, a small group of active BCC volunteers produced significant results during the first half of 2020. BCC spayed/neutered 116 cats and took 90 kittens and 2 friendly cats off the streets. Some were placed in foster homes to be socialized, fixed, vaccinated, and placed in forever homes, and some were released to Laurel Cats and to no-kill rescue groups to be put through their adoptive processes. BCC still has over




40 kittens in need of forever homes. Check out our Instagram page (@beltsville_cats) or email hello@beltvillecats.net to inquire about kittens available for adoption. BCC also fed and monitored approximately 150 cats in feral colonies at industrial/commercial sites throughout Beltsville and launched our website (https://www.beltsvillecats.net).

As a program of Laurel Cats, BCC received two small subgrants, one from the Maryland Department of Agriculture and one from Prince George's County. However, BCC relies primarily on donations (money, cat food, kitty litter, traps, etc.) from individuals and businesses to pay for spay/neuter surgeries and vaccinations, offset the cost of fostering kittens, treat sick cats, and feed industrial/commercial colonies.

Effective July 1, 2020, BCC split from Laurel Cats and began operating as a freestanding, nonprofit organization. BCC is proud of its accomplishments and grateful to the dedicated volunteers who made these accomplishments possible. BCC can always use more volunteers. 

Encryption Tools

Last month's column discussed encryption. This month, the column looks at tools used to encrypt data for everyday use. For example; the HTTPS Anywhere is a plug-in that be added to most web browsers to make certain the secure, encrypted HTTPS protocol is used when viewing a website. The HTTPS protocol uses public encryption keys exchanged between the website and the browser. These keys and their private key counterparts allow a secret synchronous key to be exchanged and used to encrypt the data exchanged between the browser and web server. When a secure HTTPS connection has been made, the browser normally shows a lock or other symbol on the left of the address bar so the user knows the connection is secure.

Protecting Files

Sometimes it is important to protect an individual file. The free compression program 7-Zip can be used to create a zip archive where the files inside are encrypted and can only be decrypted if someone knows the password. This allows the file to be stored securely on your disk or sent to another person. Imagine the file is a spread-sheet with Alice's financial data that she needs to share with Bob, her accountant. Alice can send the file to Bob using email and then call Bob on the phone and give

him the password to decrypt the file. Win-Zip is a commercial product that supports the same encryption feature.

Protecting Email

Email is in general not secure. Modern email protocols provide a secure means to send messages between email servers and clients like Outlook. However, when email messages are stored on email servers the messages are frequently stored insecurely. The goal of secure email is to provide an envelope that can be read to know how to deliver the mail while protecting the contents of the email message itself. This is where the Open PGP ("PGP" means pretty good privacy) standards come in. The Open PGP specifications allow a combination of asymmetric and symmetric keys to be used to encrypt email messages and files and send them securely through an insecure email system. The Gnu project has created the free GPG (Gnu Privacy Guard) implementation of the Open PGP specifications for Linux and Windows including plug-ins for Outlook, Firebird, and several other email clients.

Disk Encryption

Sometimes you need to encrypt an entire disk drive. Windows 10 Pro provides Bit-Locker, but this isn't available for Windows

10 Home. The free and open source program VeraCrypt regularly audits its software to make certain there are no known and undocumented vulnerabilities. VeraCrypt encrypts data as it is written to the hard drive and dynamically decrypts the data as the drive is read. The drive can even be a bootable drive, a hidden volume, or a file container (like a zip file). Accessing the file system requires entry of the password. On a bootable disk the password is prompted during the boot process. If the drive is removed from the system, the data can't be recovered without providing the password.

Attacking our Right to Protect our Data

There are well established principals in the US Constitution for us to be able to "secure our personal papers and effects." Encryption is the technology used to protect our data as we store it on disks and in files

and when we transmit it over the Internet. Encryption technology is currently being attacked by those in our government.

The US Attorney General's office is trying to get vendors of secure applications that use encryption to weaken the encryption and provide back-doors so government organizations can access our private documents and communications. The EARN-IT bill currently winding its way through Congress is attempting to force companies to weaken encryption technologies under the guise of protection against child pornography.

The newly proposed "Lawful Access to Encrypted Data Act," if enacted, would openly force manufacturers to compromise the security of the devices they manufacture and sell like phones, tablets, and personal computers by including back-doors into the security of the devices. These lawmakers do not seem to understand that if you provide a back-door for the government, it won't be long until that back-door is open to everyone. It has been clearly shown by the overwhelming majority of security researchers that providing back-doors will severely reduce our ability to protect our personal information and privacy. Please reach out to your representatives and ask them to protect our privacy.

Tax Relief for Renters

If a renter is over age 60 and has less than \$200,000 in assets, the renter is eligible to receive a tax credit of up to \$1,000. Also, Prince George's County gives an additional credit of 50% of the state credit, so the maximum credit in Prince George's is \$1,500. The renters must be living in a building where the owner is paying real estate taxes (i.e. not a government owned building). The deadline for filing is September 1, 2020. 

District 1 Office Update

In July, the county council discussed CB-48-2020, a bill that would place a charter amendment question on the November ballot to change the Homestead Tax Credit Cap to 10% from the lesser of 5% or the Consumer Price Index (usually 2-3%). The council will have heard the bill on July 21, so you will know the decision by now.

I opposed the charter amendment in committee with my council colleagues Jolene Ivey (D-5) and Monique Anderson-Walker (D-8). Together, we hosted a town hall on CB-48-2020. You can view materials from that town hall at https://bit.ly/CB-48-2020 Town_Hall_Materials.

My opposition was based on multiple reasons. CB-48-2020 was rushed at the last minute, had misleading language, and is not the right policy during a pandemic. In addition, our homeowners already pay the highest tax rate of any county in the state, and the county does not face the level of structural deficit that proponents claim.

Depending on what happened on July 21, I will follow up in next month's edition.






