





Joseph Neil Delauter, II Graduates from U.S. Coast Guard Academy

Ensign Joseph Neil DeLauter, II, a 2003 graduate of Pallotti High School in Laurel, MD, graduated on May 21, 2008 from the U.S. Coast Guard Academy in New London, CT. He is the youngest grandson of Pat and Warren Allen of Beltsville, MD and the son of Mark and Carolyn Nacewicz of Eldersburg, MD, formerly of College Park, MD.

Ensign DeLauter hails from a family that has included nine Coast Guard members during the last half century. He is the first to attain commissioned officer status and the first to graduate from the Coast Guard Academy, the smallest of the five U.S. federal military academies and the only one that does not require Congressional nomination. This highly selective institution provides at no cost a comprehensive education that includes Academics, Physical



Fitness, Character, and Leadership. Each year, more than 3,000 applications are received for fewer than 300 available slots. About 63 per cent of Cadets continue on to

graduate.

Between Pallotti High School and the Coast Guard Academy, DeLauter successfully completed a ten-month course of instruction with the Naval Academy Preparatory School at Naval Station Newport, RI.





At the suggestion of Karen Coakley at the Beltsville Civic Association's April 15 meeting, we are contacting the State Highway Administration to find out why they recommended limiting it to four lanes instead of the possible six lanes originally contemplated. Route 1 is already too crowded. We need alternatives.
