first year at St. Joseph Regional Catholic School. Mrs. Miller was very pleased with the get together and gives a highlight of what the school has been up to recently.

Here is Mrs. Miller's update. "Our 8th graders have been accepted to many of the top area schools and several have received large scholarships. Our 6th grade class just won the contest to name the PG County Parks Mascot, "Ranger Red". The student won a field trip to the parks department and went kayaking and participated in archery. Two of our students, one in 3rd grade and one in 6th grade just had their art work accepted for publication.

Rosapepe's Report to Beltsville

The Fight For A New High **Point High School Building**

As you may know, Delegates Barbara Frush, Joseline Peña-Melnyk, Ben Barnes, and I have been working with County Councilwoman Mary Lehman, the High Point Principal Sandi Jimenez and its PTSA, Beltsville Civic Association President Karen Coakley, and many others to convince the Prince George's School Board to make constructing a new building a high priority. Councilwoman Lehman and County Executive Rushern Baker got \$100,000 in County funds to study whether it would be more cost efficient to fix the existing building or build a new one. Delegate Frush and I participated in the advisory group to the School Board staff. You'll be learning more about the results of the study over the next few months but the important conclusion was that, because of the age and deterioration of the existing building, the options of fixing it and replacing it will cost about the same amount. If the School Board agrees to build a new building, it will be designed after extensive community consultation.

If you are facing eviction or foreclosure or have received a utility cutoff notice, the Beltsville Adventist Community Center can help. Funds are available to help qualifying residents of Beltsville and College Park. You will need to bring your current lease agreement; a letter from the rental office, eviction notice, or utility cutoff notice; and valid photo ID with your cur-

If you are having trouble stretching your dollars to cover food, our community center also has a food pantry for Beltsville/College Park residents. There are two options available: one-time food assistance or a monthly card. The monthly card enables you to receive pantry items once per month and to receive fresh fruits/vegetables up to twice per month.
