Their task was to design and build a stage on which the acts will take place and that will move a team member from one location to another. They then had to present a show that included an opening act and a headlining act and incorporate a technical effect associated with each of those acts. The team comprised seventh-grade students. Six of those students attend MLK: Haley Bateman, Kenny Graninger, Evelyn Jah, Rahel Mani, Marcus Jones, and Michael Stroud. The seventh team

church has expanded to include several ministerial services to strengthen families, heal broken lives, and restore the hope of those who are searching for their faith.



Tech Sense By John Bell

Pi Day

This month I am writing my column on "Pi Day." Pi Day is an annual event that celebrates the number Pi, an irrational number that is approximated to two decimal places as 3.14 and thus celebrated in the United States on March 14. Pi, of course, is an important number in geometry and trigonom-

etry because the circumference of a circle is $2\pi r$ (2 times Pi times r) where r is the radius of the circle and Pi is represented by the Greek letter π . The area of a circle is also calculated using Pi in the formula area= πr^2 (Pi times r squared). In mathematics, a rational number can be represented as a fraction, one number divided by another number. An irrational number like Pi cannot be represented as a fraction, and the digits to the right of the decimal point go on forever in a neverrepeating sequence.

Pi day has also become a time when the technology community celebrates all things Raspberry Pi. You may remember from previous columns that the Raspberry Pi is a low-cost (\$35) computer designed to help students learn more about computers. This year, the Raspber-

rv Pi celebrates its fifth anniversary since its first release in February 2012.

It seems that each year the Raspberry foundation brings out something This new. the year, new toy is the Raspberry Pi Zero W. This is a Raspberry Pi Zero (released last year) with the addition of built-in wireless networking (Wi-Fi) and Bluetooth. The board is designed to sell for \$10, which is \$5 more than last year's Pi Zero. Both of the Zero models use an ARM 11 single core processor with a Broadcom VideoCore IV graphics processing unit (GPU) and 512 megabytes of RAM. The Zeros are about the size of a pack of gum and typically run a Linux

The current flagship of the Raspberry Pi line is the Pi 3. This \$35 computer is about the size of a deck of cards and packs a quad core 64 bit ARM 7 processor with 1 gigabyte of RAM, the Video-Core GPU, and built-in wireless and Bluetooth.

In addition to the Raspberry Pi, the Raspberry Pi foundation has for robotics. Adafruit and Spark-

of these HATS. You may wonder how these little computers are being used. Clearly, the Pi is a good choice for someone that wants to learn about computers and program-Gameboy, Commodore 64, and old Atari systems.

Others have used the Pi to run 3D printers or various robots. The Pi has been used in weather stations, wildlife cameras, security cameras, and photo booths. The Raspberry Pi has become one of the most popular tools to build your own Internet of Things, thing. You can use it to create your own Amazon Alexa device, browse the web, or to write newspaper articles. Happy Pi Day!



Tackling school overcrowding and deterioration

To reduce school overcrowding and deterioration in Beltsville and across the state, I also introduced the School Overcrowding Reduction Act of 2017, aiming to reduce overcrowding more quickly, repair old buildings more quickly, and end the need for portable classrooms. School overcrowding and deterioration are major problems:

- Today, 65,297 students are in 2,839 temporary classrooms
- \$2.9 billion in estimated statewide school construction is need for FYs 2019-23
- \$438 million is estimated

We can drastically reduce school overcrowding more quickly by boosting competition in bidding, using 21st-century construction methods and materials, and incentivizing school systems and counties to be more efficient.

Protecting Maryland Jobs, Homes, and Retirement Funds

After the financial crisis and Great Recession of 2008, President Obama and Congress enacted the

Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act to protect American jobs, homes, and savings. Recognizing that President Trump and Congress have announced they intend to repeal Dodd-Frank protections, I introduced legislation to oppose these measures, creating the Maryland Financial Consumer Protection Commission to monitor federal changes and recommend changes in Maryland laws to protect Maryland working families from Wall Street abuse. Chairman Barney Frank joined me in Annapolis to testify in support along with MD Attorney General Brian Frosh and Marylanders Sarah Bloom Raskin and Gary Gensler, former US Treasury officials who helped President Obama crack down on Wall Street after the 2008 financial crisis. Last month, the Maryland Senate passed my bill, and it's on track for passage.

2017 Easter Sunrise Service at Emmanuel United Methodist Church

Emmanuel United Methodist Church (EUMC) will host an Easter sunrise service on Easter Morning, April 16, at 6:15 am. This will be the first time Emmanuel will host a sunrise service.

The Easter sunrise service in Beltsville has been hosted by St. John Episcopal Church in the past, and EUMC has been an active participant. After some discussion, the two churches decided to alternate hosting duties. The service will take place at the wooden cross in front of Emmanuel. After the service is over, coffee and donuts will be served.

Sunrise service is a worship service on Easter practiced by some Protestant churches, replacing the traditional, ancient Easter Vigil preserved by the Roman Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Anglican, and Lutheran churches. The service takes place outdoors, starts early in the morning, and is timed so that the attendants can see the sun rise while the service is

taking place.

This year it is very meaningful for EUMC to host the service because of a special project at Emmanuel. Emmanuel is building a memorial patio that will lead from the church building to the cross. During Lent, the brick patio will be built around the church cross where Easter Sunrise service will take place. The patio will be paved by memorial bricks that have been engraved with the names of loved ones in memory of them. Bricks may be ordered at any time. The patio will be completed by April 1. On that day, the patio will have at least 60 engraved bricks, and the remaining 390 bricks will not be engraved, but the church will accept orders until all of them are engraved. In a medium-size bowl, place:

- 1 stick of butter (room temp)
- 1 1/4 cup flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1 full teaspoon baking powder Stir with spoon (wooden is best) until all is mixed well.

Now,

Stir in 1/2 cup cold milk and make it into a dough

Mix it well

Dump it on a floured table Knead like bread dough until

Cover and let it rest

Prepare a small pan coated with butter so the biscuits won't stick to the pan. This is the most important step.

This mix will make 4 biscuits. Each should be 3/4 inches thick. Place them close together but not touching in the pan along with scrap. Bake for approximately 12 minutes. The bottoms should be tan.

Come on, now: do I need to tell you to use an oven glove when handling a hot pan? YES, I know you have seen this formula before, but maybe you will try it. Making great biscuits is simple and easy. The only tip I have is to make them all 1 inch thick with a 2" cutter.


