

A Beltsville Humanitarian Reflects 10 Years On

A decade has passed since that special day in 1999 when Norma Nashed founded a new charitable organization. She would call her organization Reaching Hearts for Kids (RHK). A non-profit, charitable organization, it would qualify for 501(c)(3) status, meaning that donors may treat donations as deductions for federal income tax purposes.

Ten years and hundreds of impoverished kids later, the organization that Nashed founded and still directs from her modest condominium apartment on Cherry Hill Road reaches out to over 2,500 destitute children in 13 of the world's poorest countries. Several eastern and southern African countries where RHK operates cooperative programs suffer the devastating effects of widespread poverty, civil unrest, and high

rates of HIV/AIDS infections--or perhaps all three in deadly combination, she said.

RHK exists to provide shelter, health care, food, and basic educational support for usually orphaned or abandoned kids in struggling countries around the world. There is much need for help here at home, she says, but great, great unmet needs exist among the poorest of the poor. Those poorest of countries are where she has chosen to concentrate her attention.

A clue to the genius of Nashed's remarkable success is her uncanny ability to partner RHK resources with a seemingly endless string of private donors and cooperator organizations, many of the latter being non-government organizations (NGOs). The RHK web site lists 18 formal partners and a twelve-member board of directors. Norma Nashed's name appears

with the title of Founder/Executive Director.

Nowhere are the effects of Nashed's creative genius more evident than in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. In Kinshasa, RHK partners with the Foundation for Africa in Hungary to help 1,200 students of Otheniel College with food, clothing, and educational assistance. The partners recently established a new orphanage there that houses 11 children, most the offspring of parents who have died of AIDS. Nashed says as many as 40 percent of those orphans may be infected with the AIDS virus. She notes that experts estimate that there are as many as 12 million HIV-infected orphans living in Southern Africa. According to a UNICEF report, there are 4 million orphaned children living in the Democratic Republic of the Congo alone.

The Kitchen Garden

A volunteer tomato plant sprouted in my garlic patch this spring. It survived the excavation of the garlic bulbs all around it, then flourished in erratic weather that included periods of heavy rain, drought, and unseasonably cool weather. It quickly grew to six feet tall without fertilizer, and suffered no pests and no diseases. It was the ultimate in a low-maintenance plant.

There was no indication of what type of tomatoes the plant would produce until many long clusters of tomato flowers appeared. The leading candidates were yellow pear tomatoes and cherry toma-

As the tomatoes began to

form and grow, it appeared that they were grape tomatoes. They were small and oval in shape, and they ripened to a typical tomato red color. A squirrel or chipmunk had most likely deposited the seed the previous season. Grape tomatoes had not been on the list for my summer kitchen garden this year, but I was glad to have them. They were free, tasty, and gradually ripened along each cluster in numbers that worked well for me.

The rest of my summer kitchen garden was started late and took a long time to become established. As the time approached for the annual Prince George's County Fair, I wondered what I could enter in addition to my garlic. In

previous years, grape tomatoes fared poorly in the competition because they were grouped with the traditional round cherry toma-

I checked the catalog for the 2009 Prince George's County Fair and found that a new category had been added for grape tomatoes. I carefully harvested the ripe grape tomatoes and sorted them for consistency in size and shape, then delivered 10 of them to the fair on Tuesday, September 8. The fair opened on September 10. My grape tomatoes had been positioned at the head of the agricultural display area. They had been awarded the designation of Best of Show.







Augsburg Academy Opens to Add Russian Language Class

The Augsburg Academy, 13800 Old Gunpowder Road, Laurel, will be adding a second language to its offerings for middle school and high school students starting in August 2010 when the academy begins classes in Russian.

Fr. Art Hebbeler, head of schools, announced today that the academy's addition of Russian language instruction is part of a planned expansion of course offerings for the growing Laurel school. "We are blessed to have a native Russian speaker and educator on our staff," said Fr. Hebbeler. "Olga Somers, a former news anchor from Kyrgyzstan, holds a master's degree in Russian language and literature from her home country, as well as a master's degree in education from the University of Phoenix (AZ). She is exceptionally well-qualified to take on this

important addition to our program in world languages."

The academy, now in its fifth year, offers classes to students from pre-kindergarten through ninth grade, and will add tenth grade for the 2010-11 school year. Currently, all students study Spanish as part of the standard curriculum. Russian will be offered for grades six and above beginning next fall. "We are offering Russian as one of our world languages for two reasons," said Fr. Hebbeler. "First, it is a language important to trade and diplomacy now and in the years to come, and students with proficiency in it will be wellsuited for service in the world after graduation from high school or college. Second, there is a significant population of Russianspeaking families in our region, and so few schools offer formal

instruction that many are losing the 'native' tongue in the secondor third-generation. We believe that many of these families will see the opportunity to continue that tradition as another reason to consider attending Augsburg Academy."

Fr. Hebbeler also noted that Chinese will be added to the offerings as soon as feasible, probably in the next one or two academic years. The Augsburg Academy is an independent parochial school in the Lutheran/Evangelical tradition, and serves students in pre-kindergarten through ninth grade. 





Baker Bill STUFF 'N THINGS

Well it's time to start baking again. Later I have a recipe for a good corn muffin, but for now I have a true story for all the families that live in parts of old Beltsville. My friend John Bouma lives on the corner of Tonquil Place and 43rd Avenue in a house built in 1954. like all the houses in that area. He was working in his back yard and

stepped on a spot in the lawn and fell into a dry well. Not all the way in, but one leg all the way. He called out and a neighbor heard him and pulled him out. He was not able to pull himself out. No broken bones, but a deep bone bruise. This man is in his 80's. John tells me he had two others in his yard. They are boarded over with a slab of

cheap concrete on top of the wood, then dirt and grass. The wood rots over time and the concrete is not reinforced. If you live in one of the 50-year-old houses in that area, you have a dry well somewhere. From what I can learn, all the homes had one built when new. I recommend taking a sharp rod and find a solid area in your yard. If you have a tale

to tell about a dry hole, drop me a line at bakerbill1@verizon.net.

I am sorry about last month's article. I sent the wrong one in. I am having an equipment revolt with my lawn mower, golf cart, and kitchen appliances. I hope to have no more. We'll see! This computer is giving me strange popup messages and slows to load files from time to time. It will be three years old in January. I have been doing some research on computers. I have asked knowledgeable computer persons, "How many years should a computer last?" Everyone told me, "Three to four years tops, and it doesn't matter if you paid a thousand or five hundred dollars for it." It looks as if the manufacturers build in a fail date program. I have been buying the E machine brand the last two times. Built by Gateway.

Corn muffin or corn pone

In a medium size bowl place 3/4 cup sugar, 1 cup any flour, 1-teaspoon baking powder, a pinch of salt STIR. Now add 2 eggs along with ½ cup oil any and ¼ cup milk MIX WELL. Now add 4 heaping Tbsp. corn meal, 3 heaping Tbsp cream corn*.

Mix well again. If too stiff add a bit more milk. This will make 6 full cupcake size muffins or one good size flat pan. Bake approximately 15-18 minutes at 400-415 degrees. Will be light brown and should have no wet spots. Solid. Cool first before serving.

* If cream corn is not handy, substitute 1 tablespoon mayonnaise and cut the oil by the same amount.

That's all for now. Thanks for your comments.
