

- 3. If you don't like something, try it anyway. Or, go to another room and find something


you do like.

George spent his entire working life at N.O.L doing research on triggers, fuses, mines and submarines. One of his experiments was described in *The Washington Post* about two years ago as a purposeful sinking of a sub in the Patuxent River where it remains. He has been interested in all sorts of navigation problems and is a member of the Potomac River Power Squadron.

In later years George was also active in the German-American Heritage Club (which toured a German U-boat docked at the Navy Yard), The Young at Heart Club of Beltsville, the Masonic Order, and the Berwyn Baptist Church. Many of these adventures and activities were recalled at the birthday celebration.

Rosapepe's Report to Beltsville

Protecting Fire Department Service in Beltsville and **Calverton**

Councilman Tom Dernoga, the Beltsville, Vansville and Hillandale Gardens/Knollwood Civic Associations have been working with the Beltsville Volunteer Fire Department and Prince George's County to protect our local fire service in the face of county budget cuts caused by the worldwide recession. They worked out an agreement this summer to move firefighters between the Beltsville and Calverton Fire stations so as to preserve the current level of service while reducing overtime costs. The county's new Fire Chief, Eugene Jones, who lives right here in Beltsville, met with dozens of local residents at the Beltsville Station on August 19 to explain the new arrangement and answer everyone's questions. Delegates Barbara Frush and Ben Barnes joined me at the meeting, expressing our support for the effort to preserve service and offering to work with the community to raise funds as needed for public safety. Delegate Joseline Peña-Melnyk supports these efforts, as well, but was unable to attend this meeting. Thanks to the Volunteer Fire Department, Chief Jones, and Councilman Dernoga for working out a practical way to protect Beltsville while saving taxpayers' money!

Too many people in our community and across the country have been victims of crooks preying on homeowners seeking mortgages or trying to prevent foreclosure. That's why, with the support of the state, Prince George's State's Attorney Glenn Ivey has set up a Mortgage Foreclosure Fraud Division to investigate and prosecute those who have allegedly defrauded or scammed homeowners and residents in the County. Here's what his office can do to help you if you think you have been victimized:

- bring criminal charges against individuals that had the intent to defraud:
- seek monetary restitution for
- seek fines for breaking the
- seek jail time for up to 15

His office can also prosecute criminals that did business in the County even if the property is not in our County, and prosecute cases under the Protection of Homeowners in Foreclosure Act, Mortgage Fraud Statute, theft by deception, conspiracy and other counts.

To report such a crime, write a summary of why you think you were a victim of Mortgage or Foreclosure Fraud, including as much detail as possible. Then contact his office by sending your information to Lead Prosecutor April N. Richardson, Esq. at anrichardson@co.pg.md.us or 301.952.3008; or Lead Investigator Ted Jones at trjones@co.pg. md.us or 301.952.2874.
