Local Pastor Practices What He Preaches



Galloway, Mary Lou Bell



Tech Sense

Tech Sense Potpourri

This month, I will be covering a number of technology-related bits that have recently accumulated on my desk.

Computer Scams

At my house, about once a week the phone rings, and the voice on the other end says; "Hello, I am from Windows Support. I am calling you because we are detecting errors coming from your computer." If you stay on the line, the caller will instruct you to visit a website that allows him or her to connect directly to your computer to take control of the computer remotely and "show you what is wrong." Once connected, the caller will offer to fix the computer for a fee. Be aware: this is a scam, and you will not only end up losing money but also your computer, which probably had nothing wrong with it, to start with, will be infected with malware. Friends of mine fell for this trap, and cleaning the malware from their system took several hours. If you get this phone call, just hang up. Never allow someone you do not know to remotely access your computer.

Another computer scam that I have seen may occur when you are browsing the web. A window pops up, claims your computer is infected, and says you must run a program to clean it. This window may also flash red and make an alarm sound. Instead of following the directions, shut the window down by holding the Alt key and F4 key at the same time.

New Credit Cards

Credit card technology is changing in order to protect against counterfeit cards. As new credit cards arrive in the mail, you may notice a metallic connector on the card. This connector is used to access a chip embedded inside the card. Merchants need to install and enable new readers for these cards. As of October 1, merchants that have not installed and activated the new readers are liable for fraudulent charges made against the cards. The new cards still have the magnetic stripe on the back allowing them to be read by the old readers, and the new readers can still read the old cards. The new card protects the customer because a counterfeit card can't be created from the stolen information, but it does not impact use of the card on the web.

Free Anti-virus

I always recommend that computer users run a good anti-virus program. If you subscribe to Comcast's Internet service, Comcast currently provides Norton Anti-virus for up to 7 computers. If

Calverton Elementary Rocks Positive Behavior Intervention Kick-off

Students entered the multipurpose room anxious for the start of the program. The mood was electrifying. Music played and students incanted while staff members worked the crowd singing and chanting, revving up the crowd even more. This PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions and Support) Kick-off was designed to excite the student body of Calverton Elementary School to excel socially and academically using the behavioral expectations of the program.

The PBIS committee labored to make the pep-rally memorable for everyone. Pom poms and foam fingers were available for every student, paid for with proceeds from our PBIS End of the Year Carnival last June. Students waved banners high as they

entered. The real highlight of the rally came when the PBIS committee revealed the End-of-Month activity for September: a Royal Ball! At this dance the top boy and girl at each grade level were recognized for their spectacular behavior at their crowning as king and queen of the ball. Other top students were recognized for their successful behavior by being awarded gold medallions and becoming a part of the royal court. Students new to the school learned what it means to display SOARRRing behavior from those who are returning for another year with us. Expectations for all students at Calverton are to be Safe, Organized, Attentive, Respectful, Responsible, and Ready to learn.

All throughout the year, students who display this **SOARRR**ing behavior are invited to special activities at the end of each month to honor their successful completion of PBIS goals. Last year, qualifying students participated in ice cream parties, arts and crafts fairs, movie time with popcorn, themed dances like a "Monster Mash" and, of course, the culminating activity of the year, our School Carnival. Teachers and specialists selected participants by tracking student behavior through Class DOJO, a web-based program that allows school personnel to assign points to any student in the school. Students see their scores daily and can then tell what skills they still need to develop as they receive encouragement for their positive class behavior. Because parents can check student scores on Class DOJO from home, the program also serves as a means to keep them informed on their students' progress. That way they can give positive reinforcement of their own.

In the week following the rally, the PBIS committee hosted its Annual PBIS Potluck Spaghetti Dinner as an additional way to inform parents about the program. We on the committee consider it a huge success because more than 200 students and family members attended. Parents learned more about Class DOJO, how to connect with their child's teacher on the spot, AND they received an invitation to become members of the PBIS Committee besides! Meetings are the 4th Tuesday of every month at the school, and all interested parents are welcome.

After the business meeting concluded, students and their families lined the cafeteria for helpings of delicious spaghetti, salad, garlic bread, and drinks. Desserts were available later for anyone who still could find some room!

Yes, PBIS IS alive and well at Calverton Elementary as we focus on ways to keep those Calverton Eagles SOARING!






I was going to write a recipe for pumpkin pie. But frankly, just buy the pie shell and a can of



so far and the wait to get help is also reduced.

"We're open Tuesday and Wednesday mornings each week, and people usually can get to see the county agent the day they come in," said Sheila Spinner, one of the volunteers at the center.

The center also has emergency food supplies for people who come to the center. In addition, both the center and the county can help with housing issues and with emergency medical needs.

The center offers computers that people can use along with job counseling services. "We aren't a job placement service, but we do try to help people learn how to find a job," said Dot Muse, a volunteer who helps people with job searches and resume building.

"We also offer spiritual counseling. Many people need it, and we are uniquely qualified because we are a church," Pastor Johns said. "People are welcome to come just for spiritual counseling if that's their need.

The center is located behind the Beltsville Adventist Church at 4220 Ammendale Road and is open from 9 am to 12:00 noon each Tuesday and Wednesday.

responded by bringing more than 700 pairs of shoes to the church's worship services on Saturday morning. The church holds worship services on Saturday.

Madding's biggest challenge was living seven days on the streets. He walked into church on Saturday morning dressed as a homeless person after having slept in shelters or in his car all week.

Another week, the pastor limited himself to half his normal ration of water—and "polluted" it with tastes he didn't like—to illustrate the challenges of more than a billion people who don't have clean drinking water. That week, the congregation raised money so that the Adventist Development and Relief Agency could dig a well for a community in another part of the world.

The congregation also brought hundreds of bags of food during the "Seven Days Without Food." The food will be given out through the church's Beltsville Adventist Community Center, which distributes food to as many as 70 families each week.

Madding also challenged the congregation to consider "Seven Days Without Speaking"—following the vow of silence often practiced in Christian communities.

The final sermon in the series will be "Seven Days Without Health," the service on November 7. Visitors are always welcome at the Beltsville Seventh-day Adventist Church worship services, which begin at 9:30 am and 12:00 noon each Saturday.


